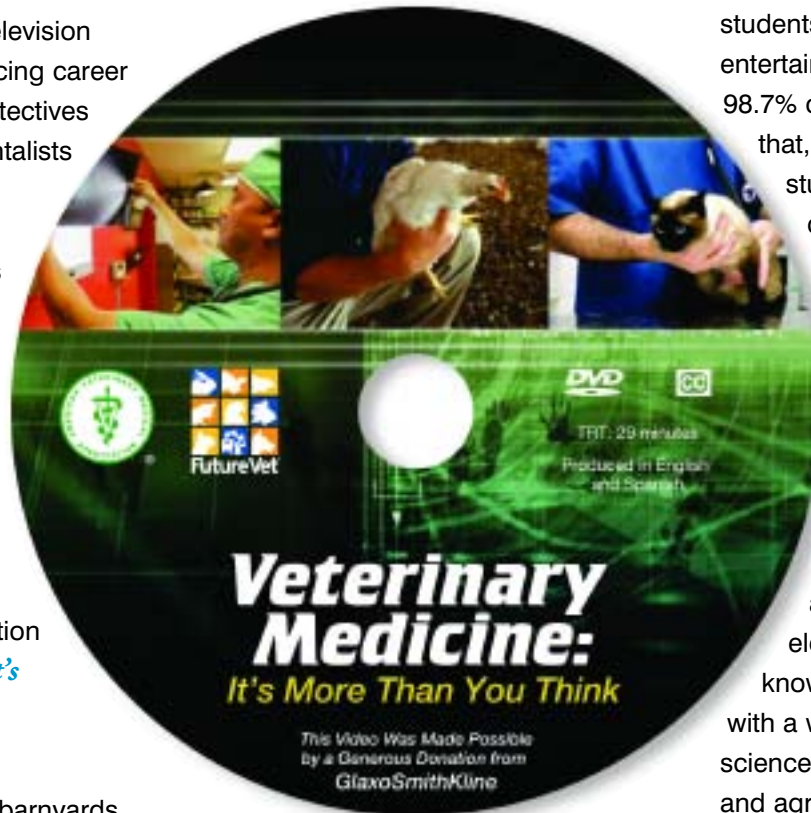

## Three New Titles For The New School Year

### *Veterinary Medicine: Bringing Science and Technology into Everyday Life*

Let's face it: Today's television programs are influencing career choices. From the detectives on "CSI" to the environmentalists on "Animal Planet" to the medical professionals on "Grey's Anatomy"...today's students see and want careers that will offer them adventure, mystery, challenges and prestige. If fulfilling all those requirements has you in a quandary, then a new DVD from the American Veterinary Medical Association – *Veterinary Medicine: It's More Than You Think* – might just be the answer.

From zoos and marinas to barnyards and from biomedical research to space travel, veterinary medicine provides students with a wide variety of exciting career opportunities. This program provides down-to-earth advice from practicing deans of veterinary colleges on how to get into veterinary school. Current veterinary students offer words of advice on life as a veterinary student. The closed-captioned DVD, produced in English and Spanish, reflects a wide range of diversity, interest areas and opportunities. Among the subjects included are food supply veterinary medicine and public health veterinary



medicine. Both of these fields are experiencing shortages and may offer financial aid to students who pursue these career areas.

This is not the first time that the AVMA has produced an exciting yet practical classroom career tool. AVMA's *Dedicated to Service* enjoyed tremendous popularity from its release in January 2004 through early 2007. During that time, the video was distributed to more than 15,000 U.S. schools and viewed by an estimated 5.4 million students. Teachers and

students alike found the video entertaining and informative. A full 98.7% of educators surveyed indicated that, after seeing the program, their students better understood why a career in veterinary medicine is worthwhile and rewarding.

Building on this success, the new 29-minute DVD engages students in an exploration of the scope of what veterinarians do through the use of testimonials, animal sequences, fast-paced video and pop quizzes. These elements challenge student knowledge and provide teachers with a wide swath of material for science, English, math, social studies, and agriculture lessons. Targeted for grades 6-12 and into college, the DVD encourages students to think about a future in veterinary medicine and determine if they possess the personal attributes that can make it a satisfying and fulfilling career.

### *The Fed Today ...from the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago*

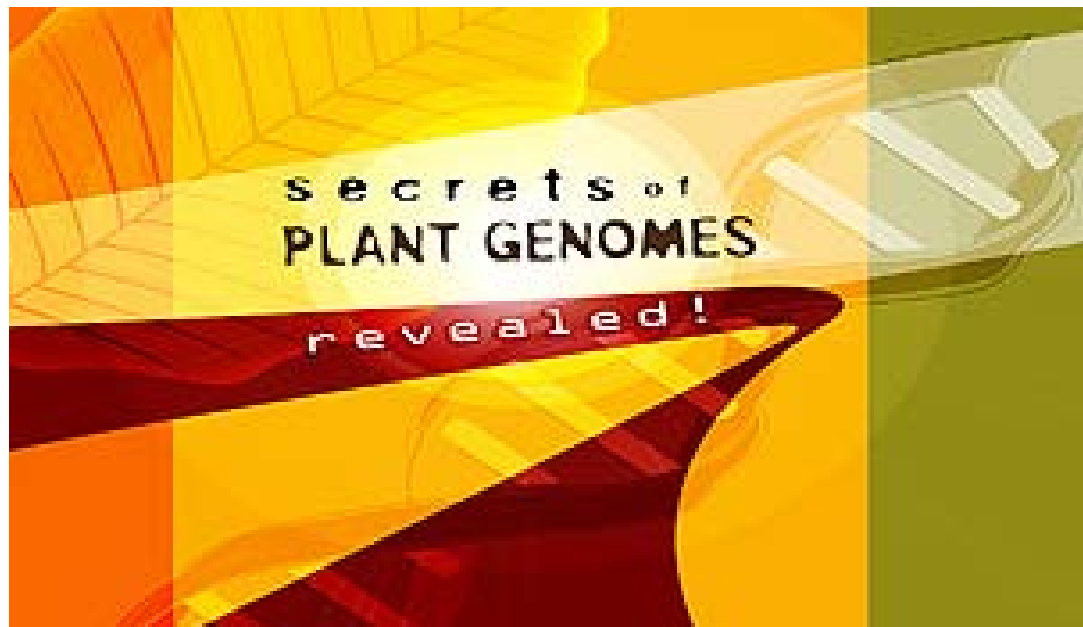

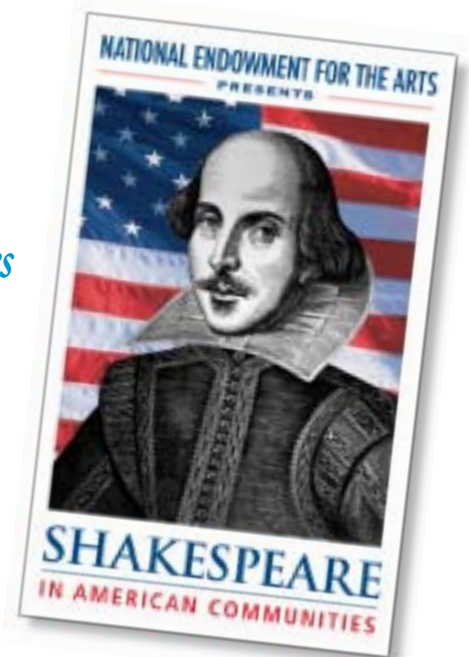

## Programs Still Available This School Year

### *Considering Your Options: Information on abstinence and contraceptive choices for teenagers*

This video, while stressing abstinence, provides information about several contraceptive options. The program includes conversations with teens discussing their choices as well as their concerns about sexual activity; it also exposes many of the “Big Myths” that are the source of the most common misinformation among teens. Sponsored by Church & Dwight, Inc., and produced in cooperation with the National Education Association (NEA) Health Information Network, this program is available for grades 6 through 12.

### *Be Sensible: Don't Drive Yourself To Distraction – Second Edition*

This driving safety program, from AT&T, will help teen and novice drivers better manage the many distractions they face behind the wheel – including wireless

devices, eating, and playing CDs. The video contains real-life stories from teens who have directly experienced the consequences of being distracted while driving. The video is shot and edited in an “MTV style” so that it is visually on target with the teen audience and offers teens specific suggestions on how to avoid common distractions. This classroom unit urges teens not to use wireless devices while driving and includes a teacher's guide with classroom exercises and a classroom poster. Available for grades 7 through college.

### *Next Generation: Insuring Your*

*Future: Second Edition* is sponsored by the Life and Health Insurance Foundation for Education (LIFE). This teen-to-teen documentary-style video defines the role of a “financial plan” while teaching the fundamentals of life, health and disability income insurance. This program also helps students understand that a financial

plan and insurance to protect it are an important part of their planning for the future. Supporting the program are an educator's guide, classroom poster, and thirty copies of a four-color, 12-page student workbook entitled “Risky Business,” which gives additional information to students about how insurance works and how to apply that knowledge to their own needs. Available for grades 6 through college.

### *Netherlands Cultural Overview*

From the Royal Embassy of the Netherlands, this program will introduce your students to Dutch people, customs, art, culture and landscape. This video has several segments, allowing you and your class to study in depth about life in the Netherlands. Available for grades 6 through college.
